TIPS FOR THANK YOU LETTERS

Write clearly and concisely, but make the letter your own, too. Bring out your own unique personality. Don't hesitate to talk about your experiences. Be enthusiastic! Be sincere. And, as always, be sure to double check for spelling and grammatical errors.

Here are some suggested guidelines to following while planning out your letter.

Part 1: Address your letter to the donor.

You can find the contact information by clicking on the name of the award in ACIS.

Part 2: Introduce yourself and state the purpose of your letter.

Make sure to explicitly name the scholarship.

Part 3: Share a little about yourself and indicate why the scholarship is important.

Include information such as:

- Class year
- Hometown
- Majors, minors, concentrations
- Organizations or Greek life you're involved in
- Sports you play
- What you've done through the programs/organizations you're involved with
- Why you chose Albion and what you enjoy most about being a Brit

Part 4: Share the impact of their gift.

Thank the donor again for their gift.
